#### RACHEL WORKS; SPA GEARS UP

Stonestreet Stables and Harold McCormick's Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro) put in her final serious work in advance of Saturday's GI Woodward S., breezing

four furlongs in :49.09 (21/58) (video) over Saratoga's Oklahoma training track. NYRA clockers caught her going the first quarter in :25.53 and galloping out five furlongs in 1:02.23. "She was very happy, came back very loose," said trainer Steve Asmussen. "If she's happy, we're happy. It was a nice,

cool, crisp morning, and the racetrack was in great shape. She looked as good as we could have hoped." Asmussen added, "We were teasing about making a training video and putting it in everyone else's stall to say, 'Try to do it like this.'" A throng of onlookers, some wearing Rachel Alexandra T-shirts and caps, was on hand for the work, among them Barbara Banke, wife of Stonestreet Stables owner Jess Jackson. "She did it so easily," said Banke. "It looks like she's just loping along, and [later] you see how fast she did it."

As Rachel prepares to become the first filly or mare ever to win the Woodward, Saratoga Race Course announced it was stepping up promotions for "The Rachel Alexandra Show." The track will hand out commemorative Rachel Alexandra buttons to the first 25,000 paid admissions Saturday, and the streets of downtown Saratoga Springs will be lined with specially designed Rachel Alexandra banners. Gates at Saratoga open Saturday at 7 a.m. Rachel Alexandra T-shirts and caps will also be available at NYRA stores this week, with net proceeds from the sales going to a breast cancer non-profit research group, the Susan G. Komen Race for a Cure. According to NYRA notes, Rachel Alexandra will be attempting to become the first three-year-old filly to beat older males in a route race that is currently a Grade I in New York since Lady Primrose, who beat the boys in the Manhattan H. in 1887.

#### BOREL, MINE THAT BIRD REUNITED

Mine That Bird (Birdstone) and the jockey that rode him to victory in the GI Kentucky Derby, Calvin Borel, will be reunited for the gelding's next two starts, includ-

ing the GI Breeders' Cup Classic.
According to Daily Racing Form,
Borel has agreed to ride Mine That
Bird in the Breeders' Cup Nov. 7,
and in his prep, the Oct. 10 GI
Goodwood S. at Santa Anita.
"We're tickled," said trainer Chip
Woolley. "Things hadn't worked out
where that was a possibility. It's a
perfect situation for us. I think everybody among us is happy to have

him back. Hopefully, it'll be the pairing we're looking for."

The game of Who's-on-Mine-That-Bird-Now first began when Borel took off the Derby hero to ride Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro) to victory in the GI Preakness S. Mine That Bird was second under Mike Smith. Borel was back on Mine That Bird for a third-place finish in the GI Belmont S., but connections of the gelding where chagrined when Borel opted to take the mount on Warrior's Reward (Medaglia d'Oro) in the GII Jim Dandy S. at Saratoga Aug. 2, rather than ride Mine That Bird in the GII West Virginia Derby on the same day. Smith rode Mine That Bird to a third placing in the West Virginia Derby, and was scheduled to ride in Saturday's GI Travers S. before Mine That Bird was scratched after undergoing throat surgery last week.

Borel was in the irons yesterday when Mine That Bird breezed an easy half-mile in :51.16 at Saratoga in preparation for a cross-country trip that will take him back to New Mexico, where he will lead the post parade for Monday's \$2-million All-American Futurity at Ruidoso Downs. The gelding is scheduled to depart Saratoga at 3 a.m. Tuesday on a van to Newark International Airport, where he will board a FedEx cargo plane bound for El Paso, Texas. After spending the night in Texas, he will be vanned to his home track at Sunland Park. It will mark the first time Mine That Bird and Woolley have been home since they departed for the 1,200-mile journey to Kentucky Derby back in April. "I'm looking forward to sleeping in my own bed," said Woolley.

the wire in :59.80 for five furlongs under exercise rider Jose Dominguez. "He's a good worker and very fast," Humberto Ascanio, assistant to trainer Bobby Frankel, said after the drill. Clockers caught Mast Track in fractions of :12.20, :23.80, :35.80 and :48 flat. He galloped out six furlongs in 1:13.40.

West Point Thoroughbreds' Awesome Gem (Awesome Again) concluded the works. Craig Dollase sent

the gelding out to a sharp half-mile drill in :47.80, prompting the condition to enthuse, "[It was] one of the best works for him that I've seen in a long time. He finished up nice and had a spirited gallop-out." Awesome Gem went evenly through :12.60, :24.60 and :36.40 splits. Prior to the move, Dollase said he was just expecting a maintenance work, since Awesome Gem ran two weeks ago in the GIII Longacres Mile, where he finished second. "He's not a very

good work horse," Dollase said beforehand. "So we'll see what 'Gem' decides to do."

#### Ground Watch for Art Connoisseur...


Richard Green's G1 Golden Jubilee S. winner Art Connoisseur (Ire) (Lucky Story) is on course for Saturday's G1 Haydock Sprint Cup, with the proviso that the ground is no softer than good. Bidding to rebound from unplaced efforts in the G1 July Cup at Newmarket July 10 and York's G1 Nunthorpe S. when last seen Aug. 21, the sophomore headed 16 entries declared at the five-day stage. "He's probably going to run, providing the ground is good or faster and it is still good-tofirm on the sprint course," trainer Michael Bell said. "As long as it's on the fast side of good, he'll take his chance and he's in fantastic form." Others looking likely to take their chance in the six-furlong contest are The Searchers Syndicate's Fleeting Spirit (Ire) (Invincible Spirit (Ire)) and Khalid Abdullah's Main Aim (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}), first and second respectively in the July Cup, and two Group 1-winning juveniles of 2008 in Jim Bolger's Intense Focus (Giant's Causeway) and Derrick Smith's **Bushranger (Ire)** (Danetime {Ire}).

#### Prendergast Rules Out BC for Termagant...

Connections of Sunday's G1 Moyglare Stud S. heroine Termagant (Ire) (Powerscourt {GB}) are taking their time to decide the filly's next target, but said the Breeders' Cup at Santa Anita is likely not an option. Following the 2 1/2-length success of Jorge Vasicek's recent acquisition in the seven-furlong Curragh contest, trainer Kevin Prendergast suggested that she may be put away until next term when the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas would be her first aim. "I haven't discussed plans yet with the owner, but we had a quick chat on Sunday and we were both in agreement to wait a week and then decide," Prendergast reiterated to PA Sport yesterday. "We could finish her off for the year unless she comes back really fresh in the next 10 days. She's got a big future in front of her and she's had two nice races now. My gut feeling would be to train her for the Irish 1000 Guineas and then, after that, she can go where she likes." Regarding a tilt in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies' Turf, for which she gained an automatic entry, Prendergast said, "It's going to cost \$100,000 to run her in the Breeders' Cup and then there's the travel. She's a grand filly with a nice temperament. We are going to look after her, as it's not as though we have dozens like her."





#### Mastercraftsman Left in Champion...

Aidan O'Brien served up a surprise yesterday when declaring Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's **Mastercraftsman** (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) for Saturday's G1 Tattersalls Millions Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown. While the 10-furlong contest has long been the stated aim of his G1 Irish Derby-winning sta-

ble companion Fame and Glory (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}), whose name features among six Ballydoyle entries out of the total of 11, the inclusion of

the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas and G1 St James's Palace S. hero adds further intrigue. Trainer John Oxx has yet to give the green light for Christopher Tsui's Sea the Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) to take his place and will be on the now-customary weather watch for the G1 2000 Guineas, G1 Epsom Derby, G1 Eclipse and G1 Juddmonte International winner in the lead-up to the weekend. Rain yesterday at the venue caused his conditioner to take a pessimistic stance towards his stable star's participation. "All is well with the horse," Oxx told PA Sport. "He came out of his last race in good shape and I couldn't be happier with him. It has been raining away here all morning, though, and the forecast for the rest of the week is not in our favour. The rest of the week is showery and the showers could be heavy at times, so we just have to hope that Leopardstown misses the rain that is forecast for the area as a whole. If we miss the weekend, we will prepare him for the Arc and see what the ground is like there." Dermot Weld has left in Moyglare Stud's G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup winner Casual Conquest (Ire) (Hernando {Fr}) and Khalid Abdullah's Famous Name (GB) (Dansili {GB}). "We'll see what happens in the week," Weld said. "Leopardstown is a great drying track and I won't be surprised if the ground is beautiful on Saturday." One notable name missing yesterday was Juddmonte's Doctor Fremantle (GB) (Sadler's Wells), who has met with a setback in training. "He had a tiny issue with a foot, which meant that he missed a bit of work," the owner-breeder's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe told PA Sport. "It was nothing too serious and he is fine now, but it means he won't run this weekend." Track officials estimated that yesterday's rainfall might have turned the ground from "good, good-to-firm in places" to "good to yielding" and added that a further update would be available today.

## WRITERS UP

Editor's note: Since passage of important federal legislation in the past 18 months, Keeneland and the NTRA have been working to educate horse owners about the new and improved benefits of racehorse ownership. Keeneland and the NTRA have asked Thomas A. "Tad" Davis, Esq., tax counsel to the NTRA and the American Horse Council, to provide the following benefits analysis for prospective buyers.

# TAX WRITE-OFFS MAKE 2009 A GREAT YEAR TO BUY A YEARLING

Thanks to the 2009 Economic Stimulus Bill and the new depreciation schedule for race horses that became effective this year, 2009 is a great year to buy a Thoroughbred. The depreciation and expensing allowances have never been better. Buyers may be able to write off a substantial portion of the cost of the horse in the year of purchase--if not the entire cost of the purchase.

The more generous write-off allowances for Thoroughbreds and other race horses purchased this year result from three changes to the tax law, all of which come into play in 2009. The Economic Stimulus Bill continued bonus depreciation for 2009, which allows a deduction of 50 percent of the cost of a yearling. In addition, it continued the higher expense deduction into 2009, which allows a taxpayer to deduct up to \$250,000 of the cost of a horse in the year it is purchased. As is usually the case in the tax law, there are some limitations and requirements that apply to both provisions.

The third change, contained in the Farm Bill, allows all racehorses to be depreciated over three years (four tax years). Prior to 2009, yearlings had to be depreciated over seven years (eight tax years). As the table to the right shows, the first year deduction is 2.5 times better than in prior years and could be three times better if the purchaser is only engaged in racing, and not racing and breeding, or just breeding. (A wrinkle in the tax law that is best explained by one's tax advisor.) The new rules let the purchaser write off 62.5% of the cost in the first two years or almost 75% of the cost if the purchaser is engaged only in racing.

#### Tax Write-Off cont.

Applying all of these write-off benefits to the purchase of a yearling this year can produce rather dramatic results. For example, if a buyer purchases a yearling this year for \$250,000 and buys no other horse or other business property this year, he can expense (i.e., write off) the entire cost.

Even if he buys a second yearling for \$500,000, he can still write off the entire \$250,000 cost of the yearling he bought first and he can take a depreciation deduction of \$312,500 for the second purchase, for a total write-off of \$562,500 in 2009. That works out to 75% of the total \$750,000 cost of the two yearlings. If the buyer is only engaged in racing, and not racing and breeding, he can use a slightly better depreciation rate that would result in \$20,000 more depreciation in 2009.

The expense deduction is reduced dollar-for-dollar as purchases of horses and any other property used in your business exceed \$800,000 during the year. In practical terms, the expense deduction phases out dollar-for-dollar, reaching zero once purchases during the year hit \$1,050,000.

In the above example, had the buyer paid \$800,000 for the second yearling, he would not be entitled to the \$250,000 expense allowance, since total purchases would have been \$1,050,000. He could still take bonus depreciation on the total cost of both yearlings (50% X \$1,050,000 = \$525,000) and regular depreciation on the balance using the new rules (25% X the balance of \$525,000 = \$131,250). The total depreciation deduction would be \$656,250, or 62.5% of the cost of the two yearlings. If the buyer is only engaged in the racing business, the total depreciation deduction would be about \$44,000 more, bringing the deduction to about \$700,000, some 67% of the cost.

It is easy to see from the examples why the current tax benefits are good for the upcoming yearling sales this year. Next year's tax benefits will not be as good unless Congress extends the current package. Bonus depreciation expires at the end of this year and the \$250,000 expense allowance goes down to \$125,000 next year, with the dollar-for-dollar phase out starting at \$500,000 instead of \$800,000.

Assuming the economy continues to improve, it will probably be a long time before a buyer gets the generous first-year write-offs that are available for purchases this year. Tax incentives such as these aren't likely to last as the country recovers from recession and buyers should plan--and act--accordingly.

Garcia and Vineyard Haven led into the stretch in the King's Bishop as Capt. Candyman Can (Candy Ride {Arg}) and Javier Castellano drew up alongside. Garcia went to the left-handed stick in the final furlong, causing Vineyard Haven to veer out and

make contact with Capt. Candyman Can, who finished a head adrift of Vineyard Haven at the wire. Stewards reversed the order of finish after reviewing the race. Through Sunday, Garcia was second behind Ramon Dominguez in the jockey standings at Saratoga with 30 wins.

#### PURGE COLT TOPS FASIG-TIPTON TEXAS A

colt from the second crop of GISW Purge topped yesterday's Fasig-Tipton Texas Summer Yearlings Sale in Grand Prairie on the strength of Midwest Thoroughbreds Inc.'s \$87,000 bid. Consigned by Inside Move, Inc. as hip 107, the colt was produced by the 10-yearold Saint Ballado mare Ballagren, a full-sister to GSP Ashmore and a half to MSW Plaid (Deputy Commander). The chestnut was bred in Louisiana by Larry Romero. The top-priced filly was hip 320, a chestnut by Tapit--Pace, by Indian Ridge (Ire) who was knocked down to J.R. and Rita Young for \$48,000. Consigned by Legacy Bloodstock, the filly was produced by a halfsister to GISW Stroll (Pulpit) and MSW Patrol (Lear Fan). She was bred in Kentucky by Ashleigh Stud Farm and Frank and Jackie Ramos. The 2009 edition of the Texas sale was greatly scaled back from 2008, when 281 horses sold over two days for \$3,369,700. This year, 184 horses sold over a single session for \$1,854,400. The average of \$10,078 was down 16 percent from last year's \$11,992, while the median of \$5,000 was up 11.1 percent. The 2009 RNA was a very high 41.6 percent, as 131 horses failed to sell. 
