

Rachel Alexandra posts final Woodward workout

On a picture-perfect Monday morning, Rachel Alexandra put in a final tune-up for her attempt to become the first female of any age to win the Woodward Stakes (G1).

The \$750,000 race is on Saturday at Saratoga Race Course.

Rachel Alexandra breezed an easy half-mile in :49.09 at 6 a.m. EDT on the Oklahoma training track under regular exercise rider Dominic Terry. The three-year-old Medaglia d'Oro filly covered her opening quarter in :25.53 and galloped out five furlongs in 1:02.23.

"It feels great to get that breeze in today under such nice circumstances," trainer Steve Asmussen said. "Cool morning, the track's in great shape, I can't say enough about the job they've done on the racetrack this summer.

"She looked very happy. She came back very loose, and she moved through the stretch very impressively. If she's happy, we're happy."

It was the eighth workout in Saratoga Springs, New York, for Rachel Alexandra and her fourth since beating three-year-old males for the second

time this year in the \$1,250,000 Haskell Invitational Stakes (G1). She will face older males in the Woodward, including Grade 1 winners

Bullsbay and Macho Again, the one-two finishers, respectively, in the Whitney Handicap (G1) on August 1 at Saratoga.

Last week, Rachel Alexandra worked on Saratoga's main track because of inclement weather. Her August 17 breeze on the Oklahoma

training track was shrouded in fog.

The Haskell extended her winning streak to eight races, including four consecutive Grade 1 triumphs by a combined margin of 46½ lengths.

"She's very special," Asmussen said. "She's extremely exciting. She just has a tremendous amount of presence with her. Somebody asked me this morning if she knew she was a star. I very much believe that she does. I think she accepts the pressure that's put on her, the attention that she gets, and I think she's really thrived under it."

Rachel Alexandra will walk on Tuesday, return to the track on Wednesday, and school in the Saratoga paddock during Thursday's races.

Rachel Alexandra has won ten of 13 career races and earned \$2,498,354. The New York Racing Association upped the purse of the Woodward by 50% to

attract Rachel Alexandra. The all-time leading North American-raced female by purse earnings is Azeri with \$4,079,820.—*Phil Janack*

Borel to ride Derby winner Mine That Bird in fall races

Calvin Borel will again be aboard Mine That Bird for the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) winner's scheduled starts in the Goodwood Stakes (G1) and Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) this fall at Santa Anita Park.

"We had been in contact with him all along," trainer Bennie "Chip" Woolley Jr. said Monday after Mine That Bird breezed four furlongs in :51.16 on the main track at Saratoga Race Course. "He knows the horse."

Borel has had an on againoff again relationship with the Birdstone gelding since picking up the mount Derby week and guiding Mine That Bird to an upset victory on May 2. Borel decided to ride Rachel Alexandra in the Black-

Berry Preakness Stakes (G1) but returned aboard Mine That Bird for the Belmont Stakes (G1) when Rachel Alexandra was not entered in that race.


Questions regarding Borel's availability to ride the Kentucky Derby winner in the Shadwell Travers Stakes (G1) led the gelding's connections to seek a multiple-race commitment from a jockey, and an agreement was reached with Mike Smith. The Racing Hall of Fame rider was aboard for Mine That Bird's second-place Preakness finish and agreed to ride him in the West Virginia Derby (G2) and Travers. Mine That Bird finished third at Mountaineer Race Track in the West Virginia Derby and missed the Travers because of minor surgery to repair an entrapped epiglottis.

Smith could not commit to riding Mine That Bird beyond the Travers because he is the regular rider of undefeated champion Zenyatta.

Racing fans have been clamoring for a showdown between Zenyatta and Rachel Alexandra, though Borel's willingness to ride Mine That Bird in the Breeders' Cup indicates that Jess Jackson intends to keep his word that his Medaglia d'Oro filly will not compete in the World Championships.

Mine That Bird will fly to New Mexico on Tuesday via FedEx. Woolley said the gelding will breeze a couple times at Ruidoso Downs in New Mexico, where he also will parade in front of fans at the All-American Futurity.

Mine That Bird, last year's champion two-year-old male in Canada after a trio of stakes wins at Woodbine, competed in the Bessemer Trust Breeders' Cup Juvenile (G1) at Santa Anita in his first start for new

ing at Aqueduct.

Six entities have bid on the 30-year contract to run the facility with 4,500 video lottery terminals.

The bids include up-front payments of between \$100-million and \$300-million, but another component of the decision-making process is how fast the licensee could begin operating gaming and making money for the state.

"Time is money," said New York Racing Association counsel Patrick Kehoe. "You'd much rather have them opened quickly. That has the potential for generating more money than a

quick cash infusion. Experience is also a big factor. I think the governor's staff will have recommendation for him this week."

Ultimately, it will be Paterson, Assembly Speaker Sheldon Silver (D-Manhattan), and state Senate president Malcolm Smith (D-Queens) who must all agree on the operator.

"The question is, what will the process be at that point for the three leaders to reach a consensus?" Kehoe said.

"There is no timetable for an announcement," Paterson spokesman

The organizations who bid on the contract to operate video lottery terminals are The Peebles Corp./MGM. SL Green Realty Corp./Hard Rock Entertainment Inc., Las Vegas casino mogul Steve Wynn, Penn National Gaming Inc., a coalition of businesses called Aqueduct Entertainment Group, and Aqueduct Gaming, which Delaware North Cos. leads.

NYRA has declined comment about preferences for a gaming operator. President Charles Hayward has said he just wants to get the facility operational as quickly as possible. NYRA will receive 7% of the gaming revenue.

Kehoe said he believes the past year's economic downturn has helped the selection process by bringing gaming heavyweights to the table. Last year, the state received only three bids, and it awarded the project to Delaware North, which later backed out when it did not receive needed financing.

"They had other projects that have either been completed or put on hold," Kehoe said of bidders such as MGM and Wynn. "MGM's multi-billion dollar City Center in Las Vegas has been put on hold because of financing. Steve Wynn recently did a big project in Macao. People who might otherwise have been doing things elsewhere in a better economy, could turn their attention to Aqueduct."-Paul Post

Texas sale follows trends with declines in average, gross

Keeping in line with the declining sales results nationwide, the Fasig-Tipton Texas summer yearling sale on Monday at Lone Star Park recorded decreases in every category except median.

This year's sale, which featured a catalog of 370 yearlings, was held in a single day while last year's book of 506 was spread over two days.

Of the 319 horses who entered the ring, 185 were reported as sold for total receipts of \$1,889,400, a drop of 43.9% from the two-day gross of \$3,369,700 last year, when 281 yearlings sold from 443 offered. The average dropped 14.8% from \$11,992 to \$10,213, but the median ticked up 11.1% to \$5,000, compared with \$4,500 a year ago. The buy-back rate was 42% this year, compared with 36.6% last year.

"I always get nervous when I see that [the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co. August yearling sale] is down by about 30%, so for our average to drop by 14%, I think we did okay," said Tim Boyce, director of sales for Fasig-Tipton Texas. "Our sale last year was just before the big [economic] meltdown, so we knew it would be tough to measure up to those figures."

A Louisiana-bred colt by Purge topped the sale at \$87,000. Consigned by Inside Move Inc., agent, the sale topper is out of the Saint Ballado mare Ballagren, who has produced three winners from as many starters.

Louisiana-based trainer Alvin Sider signed the ticket for Richard and Karen Papiese of Illinois, who race as Midwest Thoroughbreds Inc. Sider and the Papieses purchased the colt's half brother Down the Road, by Indian Charlie, for \$130,000 at the 2007 Fasig-Tipton Texas yearling sale.

"Down the Road has a little more bulk to him, and I think this one's a little more refined, but both are well balanced," Sider said. "He's a beautiful colt and I don't think you can find a fault with him. We weren't coming here to buy a whole lot; he's pretty much the one we came here to get."

Down the Road finished off the board in two starts as a two-yearold but has recorded three wins this year and banked \$77,760 for the

Papieses, who plan to campaign their new purchase in Louisiana.

The highest-priced filly was a Kentucky-bred Tapit filly from the family of Grade 1 winner and sire Stroll who sold for \$48,000. J. R. and Rita Young purchased the chestnut filly out of the winning Indian Ridge mare Pace.

Legacy Bloodstock led all consignors by total sales with 34 yearlings reported as sold for \$608,000. Pike Racing led all buyers with four yearlings purchased for \$131,500.—*Denis Blake*

Asmussens showcase their young stallions at auction

There is no better time for a stallion to get hot than just before a sale featuring several of his progeny, so when Intimidator had winners on consecutive nights during the week leading up to the Fasig-Tipton

Texas summer yearling sale, it brought a big smile to the face of Marilyn Asmussen.

Along with her husband, Keith, in Laredo, Texas, Marilyn Asmussen operates Asmussen Horse Center, which stands four stallions. The first crop of Intimidator, by Gone West, began racing this year and already includes four winners. The Asmussens offered five yearlings by the freshman sire at Monday's sale.

"We want to get them some exposure and prove our studs," Marilyn Asmussen said. "We

bred all these yearlings, and now we are trying to get them out there."

Intimidator has stood all four seasons for an advertised fee of \$1,500. The Asmussens also stand freshman sire Heckle and first-crop yearling sire Primal Storm for advertised fees of \$1,500 as well. The Heckle yearlings are his first crop of Texas-bred foals. The Asmussens offered six Primal Storm yearlings and seven yearlings by Heckle.

and Cash as an apprentice jockey—Keith and Marilyn could never pick a favorite son, and the same goes for their stallions. "The Heckles are exceptionally correct with a good attitude, and the Primal Storms also have exceptional conformation," Marilyn

the Primal Storms also have exceptional conformation," Marilyn Asmussen said. "That's really important to Keith so we are not going to stand something that's going to throw crooked foals. And we are really pleased with how the Intimidators are running."

Heckle, a Grade 3 winner by Hennessy, stood his first season at Sequel Stallions in Florida for an advertised fee of \$5,000, and his first crop includes two-time winner Syndi's Tease. Primal Storm, a Grade 3 winner by Storm Boot, raced for Keith Asmussen with his son Steve as trainer.

To help prove their stallions, the Asmussens have bred them to some of their top mares. One of the Primal Storm geldings is out of a half sister to millionaire License Fee from the family of Grade 2 winner Greeley's Galaxy, and one of the Intimidator geldings is out of Timber Jones, an Asmussen homebred multiple stakes winner by Seneca Jones, who is the oldest of the Asmussens' stallions.

"If they don't meet the reserve, we have no problem keeping them and selling them at the two-year-old sale or just running them ourselves," Marilyn Asmussen said. "We want to prove the stallions, but not at any cost. We still need to buy feed."

Like many others at the sale, which had a buy-back rate of 42%, the Asmussens are bringing some of their yearlings back to Laredo, but they sold three yearlings by Intimidator for an average of \$9,166 and one of the Heckle fillies brought \$24,000.—*Denis Blake*

Evita Argentina shortens up for Rancho Bernardo

Having already conquered males and older females in graded stakes at seven furlongs this year, Evita Argentina will cut back 330 feet for the \$200,000 Rancho Bernardo Handicap (G3) on Friday at

three-year-old males in the San Vicente Stakes (G2) in February at Santa Anita and against older females in the A Gleam Handicap (G2) on July 18 at Hollywood Park in her previous start.

Evita Argentina surged past a closing Lady Lumberjack in the stretch of the A Gleam, defeating that foe by two lengths while conceding the Hollywood Oaks (G2) runner-up three pounds, but she will give the Forestry filly six pounds as the 118-pound highweight for the Rancho Bernardo.

Ashley's Kitty finished seventh in the A Gleam after failing to close

following a ground-saving trip. She returned in an allowance race on August 16 at Del Mar to win by a length over Grade 1 winner and Rancho Bernardo contender Golden Doc A.

The probable pace presence in the race is Carlsbad. A winner of five straight races to begin her career, Carlsbad has lost two of her last three. She won the Santa Paula Stakes (G3) at this distance on March 29 at Santa Anita Park. A five-furlong move in :57.60 on August 26 at Del Mar was the best of 43 timed workouts at the distance that morning, so she may be tough to catch on the lead.

Stakes-placed winners Stolen Heart and She's Cheeky and allowance winners Moon de French and So Long Sonoma round out the field of nine.—*Ed DeRosa*

With Anticipation Stakes first major Juvenile Turf prep race

An early key to this year's Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf (G2) could be the \$100,000 With Anticipation Stakes (G3) on Friday at Saratoga Race Course, the first graded stakes race of the year for two-year-olds on grass in the United States.

The 1¹/₁₆-mile race attracted undefeated Strike the Tiger, who traveled to England this summer for trainer Wesley Ward and won the Windsor Castle Stakes on June 16 at the prestigious Royal Ascot meeting.

Ward, a co-owner of the Tiger Ridge gelding as part of a partnership, brought Strike the Tiger back on July 25 at Colonial Downs. The international travel did not appear to faze his talented two-year-old at all as Strike the Tiger controlled the pace in the 5½-furlong Chenery Stakes en route to a 3½-length score.

With three wins in as many starts, Strike the Tiger will be trying two turns for the first time in the With Anticipation. He has yet to contest a race longer than $5\frac{1}{2}$ furlongs.

Two Notch Road won the Continental Mile Stakes as a maiden in his turf debut at odds of 107.20-to-1 on August 15 at Monmouth Park to stamp himself a hopeful for the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf, a onemile race slated for November 7 at the Oak Tree at Santa Anita Park meeting.

The Partner's Hero gelding was unplaced in his three previous dirt races at Monmouth but improved dramatically in his first start on turf for trainer Glenn Thompson. Continental Mile runner-up Mississippi Hippie also will contest the With Anticipation as part of a coupled entry with stablemate Strike the Tiger. The With Anticipation drew an overflow field of 13 that includes one also-eligible entrant and two main-track-only contenders.

Trainer Richard Dutrow Jr. entered impressive maiden winner Jung Man Scott. The Freud colt finished third in his career debut on the main track at Belmont Park in July and followed with an 8¹/₄-length romp in a 5¹/₂-furlong turf race on August 6 at Saratoga.—*Mike Curry*

Summer Bird

Winner: \$1-million Shadwell Travers Stakes (G1), August 30, Saratoga

Summer Bird staked his claim as the top three-year-old male in 2009 with a 3¹/₂-length victory in the \$1-million Shadwell Travers Stakes (G1) on August 30 at Saratoga Race Course.

The win makes Summer Bird just the second three-year-old male to win multiple Grade 1 races this year (the other is Zensational, who earned both

of his Grade 1 wins sprinting on the West Coast). Summer Bird also became the 30th three-year-old to win the Belmont and Travers. The last to do so was Summer Bird's sire, Birdstone, in 2004.

SUMMER BIRD

"I was thinking about Birdstone and what he did, and for Summer Bird to accomplish the same thing with five years between ... the horse is a great horse," trainer Tim Ice said. "One thing that I loved [after the race] was that Kent Desormeaux couldn't pull him up. The outrider had to grab him; Kent wasn't going to pull him up on his own. He's a racehorse—he loves what he does."

Ice said the morning after the big win that the Super Derby Powered by Youbet.com (G2) on September 19 at Louisiana Downs, the Jockey Club Gold Cup Stakes (G1) on October 3 at Belmont Park, and the Goodwood Stakes (G1) on October 10 at the Oak Tree at Santa Anita Park meeting all are options for Summer Bird's final race before the Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) on November 7 at Santa Anita. Ice seemed to be leaning toward the Gold Cup.

"Louisiana Downs has the Super Derby in three weeks, which is a little close, so that's a longshot," Ice said of the marquee race at



Six-time champion jockey **Kieren Fallon** is scheduled to return to race riding on Friday at Lingfield following an 18-month ban for failing



a random drug test after he guided Myboycharlie to a victory in the Darley Prix Morny (Fr-G1) at Deauville in August 2007.

He received the 18-month ban in January 2008, and the 15-time classic winner will begin his comeback on Friday.

"We have had a few inquiries from media organizations we wouldn't normally hear from, including non-racing, and we expect a stronger media presence than normal," a spokeswoman for Arena Leisure, which owns Lingfield, told *Rac*-

ing Post. "Kieren is a fantastic rider, and people are obviously looking forward to seeing him."

Fallon also served a six-month ban for testing positive for a metabolite of cocaine in June 2006.

Fallon was cleared in December 2007 of charges of conspiracy to defraud in a race-fixing scandal that centered upon irregular internet betting patterns. He missed 17 months of riding in England when his license was revoked in July 2007 pending the trial. He was riding in France and Ireland prior to the drug suspension.

The much-anticipated rematch between dual English classic winner **Sea The Stars** (Cape Cross [Ire]) and Dubai Duty Free Irish Derby (Ire-G1) winner **Fame And Glory** (Montjeu [Ire]) could be washed out if wet weather forecasts for Dublin prove accurate.

The rematch is slated for Saturday in the **Tattersalls Irish Champion Stakes (Ire-G1)** at Leopardstown, which has missed the majority of the heavy rain this season in Ireland, but morning showers and steady rain in the afternoon saturated the track on Monday.

The forecasts for the next few days call for intermittent showers, and John Oxx, trainer of Sea The Stars, said the star three-year-old would be pointed to a different race if the ground becomes too soft.

"Once the word good is in the going description then I wouldn't rule out running him, even if it is just on the slow side of good [good to yielding]," Oxx told *Racing Post*.

Sea The Stars defeated Fame And Glory by 1³/₄ lengths in the Investec Epsom Derby (Eng-G1) on June 6. He is unbeaten in four starts this season, all in Group 1 races.

Fame And Glory won the Irish Derby on June 28 in his only race after the Epsom Derby for trainer Aidan O'Brien.

"Saturday's race has been the plan for Fame And Glory for some time," O'Brien told *Racing Post.* "He seems to be in good form following his break since the Dubai Duty Free Irish Derby and is ready to start back."
